Factsheet Creative Commons Licenses / AG Open Access BT 2025: Marketplace 3. April 2025



Overview

Creative Commons (CC) (<u>https://creativecommons.org/</u>) is an international non-profit organisation based in the USA.

CC Licenses are a free legal tool and enable the sharing and reuse of works such as articles, podcasts, images or videos. (They are not recommended for software or hardware). The licenses offer a high degree of flexibility:

- BY Attribution: The creator must be credited.
- ND No Derivatives: No derivatives or adaptations of the work are permitted.
- SA Share Alike: Adaptations must be shared under the same terms.
- NC –Non-Commercial: Only non-commercial uses of the work are permitted.

Main advantages of CC-BY

- You keep the rights to your work and get credit.
- The license allows free and legal sharing, reuse, dissemination, remixing, and adaptation in any medium or format.
- It provides legal clarity.

Check your LTP (license to publish) for rights transfer. CC-BY means:

- Non-Exclusive/Limited License: The copyright holder... grants permission for others to use or reproduce the work without transferring ownership. The copyright holder retains the rights to the work and can continue to use it and license it to others.
- CC licenses are non-exclusive licenses.
- Recommended by <u>DEAL</u>; <u>cOAlitionS</u>, <u>Open-Research-Europe</u>, <u>MPDL</u>, <u>Horizon Europe</u>

Problems with CC-BY-NC/ND – in DEAL (and other consortia) agreements

- Many publishers have included clauses in their license to publish (LTP) that allow them to claim
 exclusive copyright if you choose a CC-BY-NC/ND license. This means that your work can be
 commercially exploited without your explicit consent.
- Legal uncertainty (e.g. what constitutes commercial use under German law).
- Not compatible with OA definitions according to the Berlin Declaration.
